# MONASH UNIVERSITY-3 MINUTE SCIENCE COMPETITION 2023

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

#### Structure of the competition:

- 1. The competition is open to all students who are currently in grades 10, 11 and 12. Participants are capped at a maximum of 40 students at each school. Registration is based on a first come first serve basis.
- 2. The competition is only open to Johor residents. All nationalities are welcome to participate.
- 3. The registration deadline is on 26<sup>th</sup> February 2022 (Sunday) 11.50pm.
- 4. Only one single static PowerPoint slide is permitted. No slide transitions, animations or 'movement' of any description are allowed. The slide must be presented at the start of the presentation.
- 5. No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files) are allowed.
- 6. No additional props (e.g. costumes, musical instruments, laboratory equipment) are allowed.
- 7. Each presenter will be given 3 minutes presentation and this competition will be carried out physical. Any presenters exceeding 3 minutes are disqualified.
- 8. Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts their presentation through either movement or speech.
- 9. We will provide the competition topic 3 days prior the competition.
- 10. Verification on presenter's identity is compulsory and organizer has the right to request presenters to submit proof of identity documents (Passport / Malaysian IC) prior competition starts.
- 11. Presenter agrees to allow the organizer to use presenter's photos and videos (related to the competition) for promotional purposes on/after the event.
- 12. The decision of the panel of judges will be final and binding on the presenters.
- 13. The organizer reserves the final right, where necessary, to make amendments to the above rules and to select the winners of the competition.

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## Judging Criteria

Comprehension and Content

- Did the presentation provide an understanding of the background and significance to the research question being addressed, while explaining terminology and avoiding jargon?
- Did the presentation clearly describe the impact and/or results of the research, including conclusions and outcomes?
- Did the presentation follow a clear and logical sequence?
- Was the thesis topic, research significance, results/impact and outcomes communicated in language appropriate to a non-specialist audience?
- Did the presenter spend adequate time on each element of their presentation-or did they elaborate for too long on one aspect or was the presentation rushed?

Engagement and communication

- Did the oration make the audience want to know more?
- Was the presenter careful not to trivialize or generalize their research?
- Did the presenter convey enthusiasm for their research?
- Did the presenter capture and maintain their audience's attention?
- Did the speaker have sufficient stage presence, eye contact and vocal range; maintain a steady pace, and have a confident stance?
- Did the PowerPoint slide enhance the presentation-was it clear, legible, and concise?

### <u>Prizes</u>

- 1. Monash University Australia will honor each of the winner with cash prizes as under:
  - 1st Prize RM800 cash prize
  - 2nd Prize RM500 cash prize
  - 3rd Prize RM200 cash prize
- 2. All participants will be awarded a certificate of participation by Monash University Australia.
- 3. The winners will be asked to show their original photo identity card / passport at the time of receiving of the prizes.

Note: Participation to the above competition implies acceptance of the above terms and conditions.

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
